Overview

There will have been 98 days between the checkered flag at Homestead-Miami Speedway and the green that will wave over Daytona International Speedway. There has been more time to study and prepare for this race than any on the calendar.

The Daytona 500 is NASCAR's

They don't mean a thing for fantasy players. Restrictorplate, superspeedway races are the most unpredictable during the year; nothing is predictive. While that is true, there are certain indicators that will allow fantasy players to make educated guesses. Drivers at the top and bottom of the order often have patterns that help in their handicaps.

Ryan Newman has been crash prone in recent seasons, which suggests his aggression had a tendency to put him in the wrong place at the wrong time.

Young Guns don't tend to run well on this track type, but almost 25 percent of the field will be made up of drivers with four or fewer years' experience. They will be difficult to avoid; and their impact on



biggest race of the year. Teams spend hundreds-ofthousands of dollars on finding speed for this single event. They have more practice time at their disposal than for another event.

Those two facts are important to the rank-and-file fan.

TRENDS

Austin Dillon managed to sweep the top 10 on plate tracks last year. Kyle Busch would have joined him if he had not decided to ride in the back of the pack at Talladega SuperSpeedway. the running order will be even greater if theirs' is the mistake that triggers a "Big One" crash.

In Sunday's Advance Auto Parts Clash it was not the rookie Daniel Suarez or sophomore Chase Elliott that triggered the last lap accident that allowed Joey Logano

to win, however: It was the veteran Denny Hamlin who made an ill-advised block on Brad Keselowski. The first incident of that race was caused when Jimmie Johnson got loose and drove into the side of Kurt Busch. Martin Truex Jr. tried to get into a hole that was not there and wrecked his Toyota, while fourth-year Kyle Larson was essentially an innocent bystander.

That is why NASCAR runs the races. The unknowns are what contribute to the excitement of this sport.

About the only logic that can be applied to plate races is this: Simple mathematics dictates that the closer one is to the front, the fewer cars there are to run into. That is offset somewhat by the fact that the front of the pack is generally a little more frenetic and is often made more so by the fact that this is NASCAR's marquee event.

Last year's Daytona 500 winner, Hamlin has spent more time among the top 10 in the past three years than any other driver. With a record of nearly 75 percent of the time, he has statistically been the one with the fewest drivers ahead of him. That did not keep him from getting dinged up in the 2014 Coke Zero 400, but he survived that incident and finished sixth.

Dale Earnhardt Jr. has lost some of his mystique, but he is still considered the Pied Piper of the plate tracks and has the second-most laps in the top 10, but he is a rather distant second. He has circled among the top 10 only 60 percent of the time and is in a virtual tie with Logano. Johnson is fourth on the list.

The fifth-place driver is one who might surprise most players. Kasey Kahne has struggled for much of the past three years, but he had a spate of strong runs in 2014/2015 that put him among the five best twice and in the top 10 in this category one other time. Last summer, he recorded only about 45 laps in the top 10 which was his worst performance since 2013.

Still, there are no guarantees on the plate tracks.

Spread the Wealth

The fact that little is predictive about plate tracks does not mean that strategy does

not exist when the series rolls into Daytona Beach or Talladega. The strategy is just a little less common than that employed on unrestricted, intermediate speedways and short tracks.

Spread the wealth around in salary cap games. The most expensive drivers in the game are just as likely to crash as the cheapest. The big-named drivers are often the ones who win, but teams with fewer resources score a lot of top-15s. Over a decade and a half, this writer has settled on a strategy of setting plate rosters from the middle out. Find one or two solid drivers below the average cap. Next, settle on one bargain driver, then one marquee driver. Repeat the pattern as often as necessary until your final pick comes due. Then take the best available choice.

Do not exhaust an allocation on marquee drivers in Yahoo!'s contest because those

drivers will be more predictable later in the season. In effect, turn the plate tracks' weakness into a strength because one can take surprising long shots that can differentiate one's lineup. There are still a few teams that can potentially be discounted, but increasingly they can be counted on one hand.

Top-12 Drivers

1. Denny Hamlin

Hamlin's victory in last year's Daytona 500 was not surprising—beyond the fact that everything that happens at Daytona is unpredictable. Hamlin entered the race with four



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consecutive results of sixth or better, including a second-place finish in the 2014 Great American Race. Three of these four races ended in top-fives. Hamlin had not won on this track previously, but that did not lessen his aggression in the closing laps. He tapped teammate Matt Kenseth out of his way and side-drafted Martin Truex Jr. until he had the closest edge in NASCAR's history.

Hamlin was just as strong in this year's Clash. He and the Joe Gibbs Racing juggernaut led the pack late, but a surge by three Fords caught the Toyotas. Hamlin tried to block Brad Keselowski and was knocked out of the way, but he should have learned something through that experience.

Logano won the 2015 Daytona 500 and secured his spot in the playoffs early during that year's regular season. Last Sunday in the Clash, he showed situational awareness when his teammate Keselowski got a run on Hamlin. He remembered the block Carl Edwards placed on him 91 days earlier at the end of the Ford 400 and knew Hamlin was going to be just as moti-

Busch finished second in the Clash and then confronted Alex Bowman on pit road

about his unwillingness to work together to catch the No. 22. This was an exhibition race without points on the line and while there was a lot of money to be earned, Busch has plenty of that. No, what Busch really wanted was the win and that is something he runs flat out for every time he pulls his helmet on. That fiercely competitive spirit is a huge part of why he is such a great weekly value. At Daytona, that aggression can just as often get a driver in trouble, however, and from 2010 through 2014 he once crashed second in the Daytona 500 behind Logano and was fourth in the Coke Zero 400 that year. He backed that up with another fourth in last year's 500, but his luck ran out in the summer when an accident just past the halfway point sent him home 39th.

Stewart-Haas Racing has made the move to Ford this year and in a show of remarkable adaptability, Harvick buried the hatchet with Penske Racing. In the closing laps of the Clash, he drafted with Logano and Keselowski to try

qualification does not matter Τwo whatsoever. nonchartered drivers know they will race next Sunday regardless of their finishing position Thursday's qualification in races and the front row knows they will lead the field to green. Hendrick Motorsports swept the top two spots and that is particularly important for Earnhardt. No one expected him to struggle in his return, but there is always a niggling doubt when a driver sits out for as long as he did.

Junior did not need to build

his confidence, but winning the outside pole certainly did not hurt matters any, especially with teammate Chase Elliott on his inside.

He knows the speed is there; now the organization needs to get their handling tightened up so the same thing does not happen to Earnhardt, Elliott, Kahne and as what Johnson experienced in the Clash-or for that matter, to Junior in the 2016 Dayto-

Dillon was the only driver to sweep the top 10 on restrictorplate, superspeedways last year. In 2014, he swept the top 15 on this course time and in 2015, he had three such finishes in four races. That means that he has failed to earned a top-15 on a plate track as a fulltime driver only once in 12 starts. If one takes out his only anomalous result of 35th, he has an average finish of 9.5 on these courses. His single poor result came at Talladega, so Dillon has been perfect in regard to top-15s at Daytona since his rookie season. With a top-10 percentage of .714, he is hard to overlook and easily the best Group B value in Yahoo!'s fantasy game.

7. Kurt Busch

Busch missed the 2015 Daytona 500 while he was under suspension for alleged domestic abuse. He was coming off back-toback top-10s in the Coke Zero 400 the previous summer and the Geico 500 at Talladega that fall. He finished 12th in his next plate race, then strung together four more top-10s that included a 10th in last year Daytona 500. Busch finished 23rd the next time he rolled into Daytona, but that was not at all indicative of how he ran. He was running fourth exiting turn four when he was spun by Logano. He rebounded to finish fourth in the next Daytona race last summer, which means he would have a current nine-race,

top-10 streak going if not for that slight contact.

Going strictly by his Daytona career numbers, Truex wouldn't come within a mile of being included in the top 10. NAS-CAR is not only about history, however; it is also about current momentum. Truex has only one top-five and three top-10s to his credit on this track. All three of these came in the Daytona 500—including last year's second-place finish by the closest margin in the history of the sport.

Two years ago he finished eighth. Accidents in the last two Coke Zero 400s sent him home outside the top 25. If Truex is able to stay out of trouble on Sunday, he will easily score another solid finish, so the real decision will come down to how he fits on individual rosters.

ing, Keselowski rattled off three top-10s in four races from 2012 through 2014. He had already established himself as a master of Talladega with an early victory, but this track is narrower and that got Kez into trouble too often. He sustained crash damage in his first six Daytona starts. In fact, he was banged about a bit the first two times he scored top-10s, but he learned to minimize the damage. Last year, he avoided trouble in both races but was shuffled back in the 500. He won the Coke Zero 400 and now that he has tasted the champagne in Victory Lane, he is likely to want more.

10. Clint Bowyer

Bowyer has long been one of the best choices on plate tracks. In strong equipment, he is winning. capable of which he has done twice at Talladega in a Richard Childress Racing car. In mid-range equipment, he was still able to hang with the leaders and he scored three results of 11th or better in 2013 and then three top-10s each in the next two seasons. In modest equipment, he nabbed two top-10s last year. That suggests the driver is the one making the difference. In 2017, Bowyer has looked confident and fast in Tony Stewart's old ride and he should easily be able to score a top-10.

for most of last year and finally got the results he deserved with three top-10s; two of these came at Daytona—and one of them was earned despite suffering some damage. Larson got banged up in last week's Clash and that could either indicate that his luck has turned bad again. Alternately, it could mean that he already suffered all the illfortune he is going to.

> Elliott finished seventh in the Advance Auto Parts Clash last Sunday, but at least he made it to the finish line without damage. And, lest reader think this is a snarky comment it should be noted that was Elliott's observation on pit road afterward. Elliott's average points earned in the NASCAR.com Fantasy Live game might best illustrate his challenges on this course with a negative 12.25 in two races. Much of that came as the result of a 36-point place-differential loss last year in the Daytona 500 after he led the field to green.

This year, he won the pole for the second consecutive year and that might not be good news for owners in

games that have this mechanism as a scoring option.

Everyone was surprised when Carl Edwards decided to step away from NASCAR. Undoubtedly, that included Suarez who suddenly found himself in the role of assuming one of the best cars in the field. He has no excuses for bad finishes and there will be no way to hide from the limelight.

The situation is similar to what Logano faced when Stewart made the decision to leave Joe Gibbs Racing with a year remaining on his contract. Suarez is going to have a few bumps along the way, but he is liable to win Rookie of the Year honors. So far in 2017 Speedweeks, he seems to be doing just fine and has not made any mistakes worth noting.

With one Daytona race off so that a rent-a-driver could run the No. 95, McDowell has been with this team since the beginning of 2014. He failed to advance out of his heat race that year, but came back to finish seventh in the Coke Zero 400. His only start the next year was the Daytona 500 and he did not finish well. Last year he swept the top 15 in both races on this track. Notably, he started 39th before finishing 15th in the 500 and moved up 27 spots to 10th in the 400. For a modest price tag in all games, he might be the best value available this week. Unfortunately, there is a downside to that. He is a good differentiator and if he gets swept into a crash and

Patrick's earliest success came at Davtona. She won the pole for the 500 as a rookie and unlike Elliott from last vear. she stayed out of trouble for the entire night. In the late stages of the race, she had a shot at a top-five, but got shuffled slightly and finished eighth on the final lap of the 2013 Daytona



500. She has not come as close to hitting that mark since, but did get another eighth in the rain-shorted Coke Zero 400 in 2014. Patrick has looked good so far in this year's Speedweeks. She was side-by-sideby-side with Dale Earnhardt Jr.'s No. 88 (with Bowman behind the wheel) and Busch's No 18 in The Clash for a topfive finish. And while Elliott had the pole this week to recommend him and Earnhardt is-well, Earnhardt-Johnson is too big a risk in a race that is often little more than a lottery.
