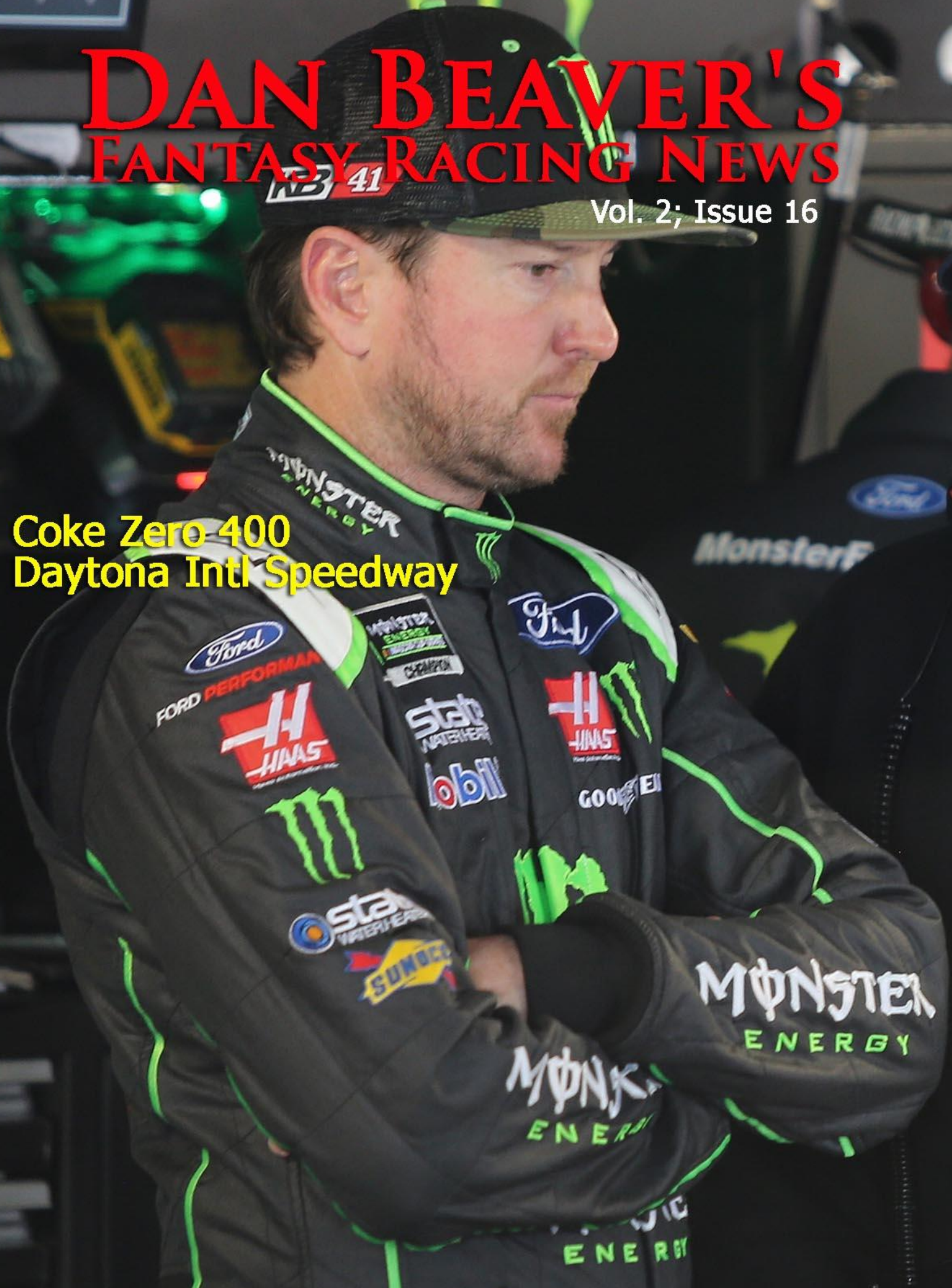

OVERVIEW

The traditional name of this weekend's race is the Firecracker 400. We would like to suggest a change.

From this point forward, the race should become known as the "Maybe 400", with Talladega SuperSpeedway's two events labeled the "Lottery 501" and the "Perhaps 500". We're not crazy;

co 500—sorry, the Perhaps 500—are not only the two most recent plate races, they provide great examples of the unpredictability of this type of event.

At Daytona while teams were still trying to figure out the best way to play the segment strategy, a group of Toyotas pitted early and got back on track to settle in just ahead of the leaders on the tail-end of the lead lap. Kyle Busch was determined to stay in front of

cleared, nearly half the pack—17 cars—sustained some damage including one of our favorite sleeper Michael McDowell who was running 15th at the time.

Still, there are drivers who run strong on this course and dark horses that seem to make their way to the front of the pack almost every week. And the fact that there are no guarantees in this sport, does not mean that a player cannot hedge their bets

that first race of the season should always remain the Daytona 500.

The outcome of a restrictor-plate, superspeedway race is impossible to predict, but that does not mean they cannot be handicapped.

LEAD, FOLLOW, OR GET THE HELL OUT OF THE WAY

Both of the major incidents noted above happened among

the leaders, but despite that, the front of the field is typically safer than mid-pack. At some point during the Maybe 400, nearly every driver entered will have an opportunity to log a lap inside the top 10. The pack surges and wanes throughout the day especially following a caution flag.

One line gets a run and it brings its drivers forward indiscriminately. Those drivers—unaccustomed to being in the lead pack—can be prone to making a minor mistake that has major consequences. That is what happened with Allmendinger this spring and the scenario has been repeated many times during the course of history. But the best in the sport can also make mistakes especially when they feel pressured.

Last week, Kevin Harvick became the 10th unique winner to currently qualify for the playoffs with a victory. That means only six positions are available based on points with 10 races remaining and a lot of name-brand drivers on the outside looking in.

With his encumbered win failing to give him a playoff berth, Joey Logano sits less than 12 points above the bubble—and 12 points can evaporate in the blink of an eye on plate tracks. Kyle Busch is

another driver who should have a win by now and each week that he fails to find Victory Lane adds one more layer of frustration.

Matt Kenseth and Denny Hamlin have also failed to win.

And there is the not-so-little matter of the fact that anyone can get to the checkers first on plate tracks and a road specialist could win Watkins Glen International before the playoffs. The anxiety level in the lead pack is going to be high and eagerness often leads to mistakes.

SPREAD THE WEALTH

Because anything can happen on plate tracks, the best course of action is often to spread the wealth in salary cap games and do not allocate drivers who are likely to be more predictable in pick 'em games. The only problem with that strategy is that some of the biggest names have been unpredictable this year.

Jimmie Johnson has been either great or mediocre in alternating races, Logano has been in a tail-spin since he won at Richmond International Raceway, and the Gibbs' guys have been less-than-impressive on similarly-configured, 1.5-mile tracks.

Instinct is going to play a key role this week. Fantasy players will also be well-served by creating multiple rosters in games like Draft Kings so they can hedge their bets against a "Big One" crash.

since Busch was a number one pick and while this might



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seem like a reactionary response to his winning the Daytona 500, we are fully aware that is his only win on this track. Busch does not need to sweep Victory Lane in order to be a good value, however; his consistent strong runs make him worth starting because it shows that he has managed to avoid the carnage more often than his counterparts.

In his last 11 restrictor-plate, superspeedway races, Busch has finished 12th or better 10 times. His last three efforts have been sixth or better.

Last week we also said Busch should be a good value on the road course of Sonoma Raceway because of his consistency there. He finished seventh. Teammate Kevin Harvick won the race, which should shed

some of the malaise at Stewart-Haas Racing and those factors should combine to make Busch a very strong choice this week.

Earnhardt lands in the number two slot for some of the same reasons that Busch is ranked so highly. He finally has a little momentum on his side and he has been consistently strong on plate tracks in the past. In his case, that past is a little more distant, but then again his numbers on this course type have tradi-

tionally been better as well.

In 2015, Earnhardt won two plate races and had a worst finish of third. He may have used up all of his luck that season, because he has failed to crack the top 20 in five races since.

When the Daytona 500 rolled around, there were some concerns because his performance on this track type was not as strong as in the past, but he was leading when the "Big One" crash eliminated him.

Earnhardt is still attractive

With great risk comes great reward. Busch is the consummate all or nothing driver on most course types and that is particularly true on plate tracks. Seven of his eight career top-10s at Daytona were in the top five. More than two-thirds of his starts on this track ended outside that mark, however, and that should be the cause of some concern.

Four of his last six plate efforts landed in the top five, including a pair of second-place finishes last year; his other two races in that span

The stats' block for Hamlin and his teammate Busch look pretty similar. The driver of the No. 11 also has a tendency to either finish in the top five or outside the top 10—and Group A drivers in the Yahoo! game must score top-fives most weekends to be the top value.

Hamlin is attractive this week because he entered last year's Coke Zero 400 with a five-race streak of finishes sixth or better at Daytona, including a win in the 2016 500. In all of those events, he also earned positive place-differential points and that is important in games that offer them because it does not subtract from the finish result.

on plate tracks because of his popularity. He will be on so many rosters this week that if he falters, he is going to take your competition down with him and if he wins, you cannot lead your league without him.

Busch will look impressive for much of the afternoon, but fantasy players will not breathe easily until the checkers wave. He is prone to driving over his head when he is desperate and each week that passes without a victory is making him a little more frustrated. On the other hand, everyone is a bit of a coin toss on restrictor-plate, superspeedways, so he lands among the top five based on his raw numbers and Fantasy Power Rankings' score.

Hamlin's last two Daytona races have not been as strong, but with back-to-back 17ths, he has at least avoided going home with bare minimum points.

top-10 percentage among this week's top five. Now, part of the reason for this is that he has only eight starts on this track, but when one can statistically outperform Earnhardt on a plate track, it is notable regardless of the circumstances.

Dillon has achieved a career average finish of 12.6 at Daytona based on consistency—and that makes this his best NASCAR Cup track. Since he has been racing fulltime, he has failed to crack the top 10 only twice and outside the top 15 once. His worst result was his latest effort and even that was in the front half of the pack with a 19th.

That might foretell a change in fortune for the worst or he could rebound. Players won't

know until the conclusion of the Coke Zero 400.

We expected much more from Logano last week. During the seesaw Toyota / Save Mart 350k, many drivers spent time with the leaders before getting relegated to a sub-10th-place finish, but the No. 22 never really seemed to be in contention. Still, his finish of 12th was much better than he has experienced since the encumbered Richmond International

Raceway win and should point to a change in momentum.

If fantasy players have restored-confidence in Logano, they can handicap him based on the five results of sixth or better in six plate races from the 2015 Talladega fall event through this year's Daytona 500. If they do not feel like his season has turned around, they will be concerned about his 32nd-place finish in the Geico 500.

Daytona is fraught with danger. Bowyer has sustained crash damage in five of his last six attempts there and blew an engine in the 2014 Coke Zero 400—and yet, he has four top-10s to his credit. All four of those solid results came with wrinkled sheet metal. In racing, it pays to be both lucky and good.

Bowyer has managed to score top-10s at Daytona with all of his previous owners. He debuted in 2006 with a sixth in the 500 and 10th in the 400. He has three fourth-place finishes on this course type, the most recent of which came with Michael Waltrip Racing. Last year, he finished ninth in the Coke Zero 400 racing for the embattled HScott Motorsports' team.

Bowyer crashed and failed to finish this February in his first attempt with Stewart-Haas Racing, but we would be willing to bet he gets a top-10

this week.

Larson's overall, career plate numbers really do not support his being a top-10 driver but he has been improving recently. He finished seventh in last year's Daytona 500, was sixth in the Coke Zero 400 and again in the Hellmann's 500. This spring, he finished 12th at both Daytona and Talladega.

Larson is still seeking his first plate top-five and that is an important fact to remember in allocation management games like Yahoo!'s because he is going to be a much better value on other tracks.

Blaney came within one position of guaranteeing his spot in the playoffs in the very first race of the season. He finished second to Kurt Busch in the Daytona 500, which gave him a lot of momentum through the first several races of the season. He lost that impetus with a 39th in the Geico 500 at Talladega, but has since regained it with his Pocono Raceway win. NASCAR Cup racing can be cyclical like that.

McDowell has finished 16th or better in four of his last six plate races. He was on his

way to earning his fifth consecutive result of 16th or better when he was taken out in a late-race "Big One" crash; he was running 15th at the time. He finished 10th in this race last year. McDowell has advanced from his starting position at Daytona in four of his last five attempts.

Last week he scored his third top-15 of the season when he finished 14th at Sonoma and that was enough to make him the top performing Group C driver in the Yahoo! games. This was his fifth top-20 finish of the season as well.

Like Kahne, Menard also has back-to-back top-10s this year on plate tracks with a fifth at Daytona and ninth at Talladega. He's finished in the top 15 in three of the last four races. Menard has finished ahead of his qualification spot in two of his last three starts at Daytona, including this spring where he advanced 28 places from 33rd to fifth.

The two Plate track races are been Menard's only top-10s of the season thus far. But he came close last week with an 11th place finish at Sonoma and that adds to his momentum.

Since Talladega, Kahne has had only one other top-15 on other track types—finishing 17th or worse in the last five races. This hopefully will give him the chance to turn around the season if he doesn't run

Stenhouse has had four top-15's since his win at Talladega, bringing his total to 11 for the season. He should be able to rebound quickly from last week's DNF since Daytona plays by its own rules.
